"As we welcome the season of renewal and early blooms, the AWHONN Illinois Conference Planning Committee worked very hard to organize this year's annual spring conference, held at Maggiano's Little Italy in Schaumburg, Illinois. I'm thrilled to share that we had a strong turnout, beginning with our pre-conference event on April 9, "Tales from the Witness Chair: How to Survive a Deposition," presented by Adam Snyder, JD. This engaging session welcomed 80 nurses and set the tone for an impactful conference.

On April 10, our main conference brought together 114 nurses for a day of learning, connection, and inspiration. We opened with humor and camaraderie and moved into insightful presentations covering Perinatal Genetic Testing, Mastering OB Anesthesia, Congenital Syphilis, and PTSD in Birth Professionals. Neonatal Advanced Life Support (NALS)-Developed in collaboration with the American Red Cross, this program provides evidence-based, scientifically validated training to address the urgent need for skilled neonatal care, especially in maternity deserts—areas with little to no access to maternity services.

Neonatal Resuscitation Program- fall 2025 the 9th Edition of NRP will be launched.

CCHD- The American Academy of Pediatrics published updated guidelines to the Newborn Screening for Critical Congenital Heart Disease this year. Changes to the guidelines originally published in 2011 are as follows:

- Lower limit of an acceptable oxygen saturation should be ≥95% in both the pre- AND post-ductal measurements leading to less confusion and misinterpretation.
- · Recommendation to retest only ONCE after an "indeterminate" result leading to shorter time to recognition of a critical congenital heart defect.
- · The newborn should be in room air and not receiving supplemental oxygen to avoid false negative screening results.
- · Education on the limitations of screening and that CCHD may still be present in a newborn who has "passed" the screening. CCHD screening may lead to the identification of conditions leading to hypoxemia other than congenital heart disease. Some examples provided include: hemoglobinopathies, persistent pulmonary hypertension, sepsis, and non-critical congenital heart defects.

Legislative Lines

Learn How You Can Make an Impact

On Monday, April 28, AWHONN will fully prepare you to meet with the staff for your members of Congress with a full day of briefings on bills, training on how to lobby, and a rundown on logistics for our annual lobby day. Then on Tuesday, April 29, meet with staff for your representative and senators to lobby for the advancement of legislation. Don't worry! AWHONN will pre-schedule your appointments and provide you with talking points before your 20-30 minute meeting with each office.

Here's What You'll Be Advocating for at AWHONN on Capitol Hill

- Preventing Maternal Deaths Reauthorization Act: This bill reauthorizes programs from the Preventing Maternal Deaths Act, strengthens federal support for maternal mortality review committees, enhances surveillance of pregnancy-related deaths, and aims to reduce disparities in maternal health.
- Maternal Health for Veterans Act: Part of the Black Maternal Health Momnibus, this bill requires the VA to report annually through FY2028 on maternal health care coordination, veteran health outcomes, and recommendations for improvement. It also authorizes funding for VA maternal health programs through FY2028.
- Title VIII Nursing Workforce Development Programs Reauthorization and Appropriations: We'll be advocating for increasing funding for the federal Nursing Workforce Development Programs in the annual Labor, Health and Human Services, Education appropriations bill. We will also be advocating for a bill to reauthorize the Nursing Workforce Development Programs.
